


MAYOR'S MESSAGE

CITY NEWS

Thank You and Welcome

On behalf of the city, I offer our sincere appreciation and thanks for the incredible work outgoing Gazette Editor Lee Ann Pingel has done through her many years of service.

She worked hard to make the Gazette what is it today, and so many citizens remark on just how much they love it. Thank you, Lee Ann.

And... Welcome Anita Turlington! Anita has taken over for Lee Ann, and she has hit the ground running. We look forward to her vision and expertise as we continue to inform all of you on all things Winterville.

Stormwater on Main Street

As you know, we were awarded 3 projects under the Athens-Clarke County Unified Government's 2023 TSPLOST funding, and one of those is about to get underway. Flooding on Main Street has been a problem for the city for a very long time, and we hope to remedy that in 2023. The approximately \$3 million project will replace piping, curb and gutter underneath and along Main Street from Henry Meyer to the Baptist Church entrance. The ACC and the City of Winterville will begin work soon; expect some inconvenience as we open and close the road, so apologies in advance. We appreciate the County for including these projects on their TSPLOST, and we look forward to safer streets and sidewalks over the next several years.

B and B Ordinance

The city imposed a very strict B and B Ordinance a couple of years ago, and we are making some revisions next month. The changes pertain to ownership and management as well as taxes on short term rentals in the city. The Council will vote on the proposed changes at the April meeting. Please attend the Public Hearing advertised in this gazette if you wish to hear more and offer any comments.

Moore's Grove Road Re-zone

The Re-Zone and Planned Development of the Moore's Grove Road Property by J. W. York Homes was not approved by City Council. A portion of that property is owned by the developer, but no other project or proposal for that property has been presented to the city.

Community Center/Upstairs Renovation

Renovation of the upstairs of Winterville Center for Community and Culture is underway and should be completed in the next few months. The original floors have been repaired, and much of the original character will be preserved as we lightly renovate the space to create opportunities for the Winterville Arts Council, the Center and more.

Auditorium Deck and Concession Area

Public works has been busy building a new deck outside and a concession area inside the Marigold Auditorium for Arts and Culture (MAAC). Check out an upcoming show, enjoy the new amenities, and thank your public works crew when you see them.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR FOR THE MARIGOLD MARKET!



Opening day for this year's market will be April 15th and we are planning an exciting year! This will be the fourth year Winterville has hosted the market, and we have seen continued growth and support from the community every year. Last year we averaged over 300 people each week shopping at the market and had 17 regular vendors.

This season we are excited to welcome back our returning farms: Daisyfish, Sungate Farm, Lazy Summer Farm, Belly Acres Homestead, Athens Orchard, Athens Bees and The Grove. We also hope to welcome some new produce vendors including Amy's Sunflower Garden, who will be providing cut flowers as well as produce and edible plants for your garden. Those who supported the market last year will remember enjoying fresh mushrooms from Classic City Gourmet Mushrooms. Thanks to your support they were able to grow their business enough to get into some of the area's larger markets; however, we will still

be able to supply you with their mushrooms through our co-op tent and special orders. You'll be able to stock your pantry with coffee from **Mr. Bill's Beans**, bread and bakery items from **Tina's German Kitchen** and **The Green Table Bakery**, and sauces from **Tastenini**. We will also be welcoming new live plant vendors, **Gentle Dispositions**. In addition, we will partner with **Coile Middle School FFA**. The middle schoolers and their families will be selling cut flowers and produce that is grown in the school garden. All of the funds that the school makes through the market will be put back into their FFA program. In addition to the FFA, we hope to host Coile's children's orchestra and band for our entertainment performances. These are just a handful of the new and returning vendors, and we hope to be adding more throughout the season.

While you peruse the market, grab a bite to eat and listen to some local music! We will be supporting **Ceylon Snack Hut** through the co-op tent this year. Thanks to your support through the market and the use of Winterville's shared kitchen, they were able to get their small business off the ground. We will still be able to enjoy their food while they reach others in the Athens area. We also welcome back **Jazzy J's** with her delicious eggrolls, and **Ray's Recipes** Jamaican dishes. New to Saturday markets this year, **Shawanda's Kitchen** will be joining us to teach us about cooking and meal prep. Shawanda has been an active member of our community for several years now working with FC-CIS and distributing food throughout the community.

Speaking of distributing food through the community, did you know that the Marigold Food Hub distributes fresh food to more than 60 food-insecure families monthly, as well as to a couple of local women's shelters? The Marigold Market and Food Hub have worked together in past years to provide fresh and nutritious food to the community by purchasing any unsold produce after the market and redistributing it during the week. Last year the farmers sold their remaining produce to us at a reduced cost, and we were able to purchase these unsold items using funds collected through the market. While this is a better alternative than taking unsold items home to a compost pile, one of our goals this year will be to compensate our produce farmers fully for their unsold items. Not only will this put money back into the community, but it will also attract more produce vendors, which will in turn provide a greater variety of fruits and vegetables. We are looking for community sponsors who would be willing to donate to the Food Hub to increase the amount we are able to compensate the farmers. When you shop at Marigold Market, you are supporting local small businesses in tangible ways. You are also buying produce that has been picked only 24 to 48 hours before market, giving your purchase a longer shelf life. Get to know our local farmers and provide moral support for them while also building community.

Luckily, Engine 1 will stay in service in the state; the City of Barnesville purchased it as a backup engine.

April 15 Event Opens Two New Exhibits

On April 15, only one year after reopening, we invite you to visit our most ambitious expansion yet, the opening of a new exhibit space and the dedication of the Charles and Kim Burch Botanical Medicine Garden.

The Botanical Medicine Garden is the work of a collaboration between Museum staff and a group of advisors (including UGA Founders Garden Curator Maureen O'Brien). Together, we designed, built, and prepared a 450-square foot educational botanical medicine garden adjacent to the museum. Funded by a grant from Georgia Humanities, the garden offers a new dimension of storytelling and immersion at the museum. All of the plants selected were cultivated for medical use in Georgia between 1870 and 1940, and all have been carefully selected to eliminate toxicity. Even so, this garden's produce will not be for use or consumption but educational and demonstration only.

I'm Not a Doctor But I Play One on TV, our inaugural short-term exhibit, will open in the newly-renovated back room of the museum. This exhibit explores the ways that country doctors have been portrayed on screen and in print with original artifacts from Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman, Little House on the Prairie, Bonanza, and more.

We hope to see you on April 15 for the official opening of the Garden and Exhibit!

The museum is open from 10-2 every Tuesday-Saturday. We'll see you there!

FIREFLY TRAIL

Even though the first three months of 2023 have been chilly and wet, we've noticed an upswing in use of the Firefly Trail in Winterville and along the other completed trail segments. And that trend coincides with progress being made at several locations along the 39-mile corridor, so there's plenty of excitement about this fabulous project.

Snowflake 10K Kicks Off 2023 Firefly Trail Race Series

No one complained about the weather that greeted participants in the Winterville Civitan Club's Snowflake 10K on January 28th, not after the bitterly cold winds that blasted the event a year ago. This time around close to ideal conditions greeted more than 150 runners and walkers and the race organization was flawless. The 10K served as the opening event of the 2023 Firefly Trail Race Series, put on annually to highlight progress being made with the project and build support for an alternative transportation and recreational resource that will benefit the entire region.





Winterville Friends of the Firefly Trail

Initially known as the Winterville Firefly Trail Local Action Committee, this organization has been renamed Winterville Friends of the Firefly Trail to better characterize its role as a supportive volunteer group. The WFFT typically meets via Zoom the second Wednesday evening of each month. And, while focused for now on the completed trail segment in Winterville, the organization will also keep up with trail-related issues and needs between Winterville and the Ranick Road/Hancock Road vicinity.

Firefly Trail Development Update

A ribbon-cutting date hasn't been set, but work on the new Firefly Trail Bridge over Trail Creek in Athens will be completed this April. A sometimes contentious, long discussed and debated project, the bridge will be a beautiful and iconic feature of the Firefly Trail. We appreciate all of the public input and support, plus hard work by ACC staff and elected officials, that has been essential to getting the bridge completed. Closer to Winterville, ACC staff continue to work on right-of-way acquisition for the 3.2-mile segment between Hancock Road and the Winterville city limits. Actual construction of this final piece of the Firefly Trail in Athens-Clarke County is anticipated to being within the next four to six months. And construction work is moving along impressively in Greene County for nearly six miles of trail slated to be completed by late summer. Funding for the work comes from a \$2.1 million Georgia Outdoor Stewardship Program grant plus close to \$600,000 in local match contributions and a \$200,000 donation from Firefly Trail, Inc.

Winterville Elementary School Art Show

WAC has had a busy start to 2023! In February, WAC hosted our annual Winterville Elementary School Art Show. This year the students' art focused on building community through printmaking. WES art teacherCarli Brownlee stated, "We began this project by looking at and discussing the work of exemplar printmaking artists, Anita Laurence and Sarah Kirby. These two artists explore the emotional significance of place and space, and how these spaces hold significance for individuals as well as communities. Students then designed their own building or structure, turned their design into a relief print, and printed at least 4 copies of their designs. The prints highlighted in this show were intentionally printed together to create a community of structures within each class and are now displayed together creating a larger community representing our WES student body."

Oil Painting Class Pitcher Plant Challenge

Oil Painting class has been ongoing for almost six years, and many student artists have participated regularly. The object of this class has been to teach individuals the fundamentals of painting while giving them a new or renewed approach to spending time at a meaningful endeavor. Painting is a solo activity, but in a class, the artist has reinforcement and support with the added benefit of socializing.

The latest exercise was for each student to paint Pitcher Plants from a photo taken at the Georgia State Botanical Garden. They started with a black and white photo of the scene in order to capture the dark and light values first. Once the images were completed in black and white, color was added while keeping the color values the same. Many people confuse value with color, so this was a good exercise.

Part of the lessons include suggestions for a challenge. One such challenge was to paint using anything but a brush. Most students enjoy being challenged and know they are not obligated to participate. Many of the students bring in photos of something personally meaningful such as images of scenes from trips, photos of friends and family. As the instructor, I help each student with whatever they are working on.

Coile Middle School


Coile Middle School recently purchased a set of VR headsets. In the images below, 6th grade science students use VR to explore the formation of a storm cell and funnel cloud in a virtual walkthrough of a tornado, in order to understand the mechanics of the storm.
