

In a world where access to fresh, healthy food is not always guaranteed, the Marigold Collective is stepping up with a vision: to ensure that everyone in our community is nourished - not just with food, but with connection, dignity, and purpose.

out vegetables or hosting markets. At the Marigold Collective, we work on multiple fronts - supporting local food producers, educating families about nutrition, and creating opportunities for neighbors to



share in the abundance of local harvests.

"Food is a basic human right," says Lydia Engelsen of Sungate Farms and a Marigold Collective board member. "But it's also how we build relationships, pass down traditions, and care for one another. When we invest in local food, we're investing in the health and strength of our entire community."

One way Lydia is choosing to care for the To us, this means more than handing community and preserve tradition, along with Adam and Hannah Reynolds of Wild Acres Farm, Lori and Chuck Ros of Lavender Blu, and the Incubator Farmers at Athens Land Trust, is through our heritage pea project, Peas for the People. In this initiative, several farms have volunteered to dedicate portions of their land to growing "Smith Peas" — a Choctaw Nation crop whose roots trace back to the Trail of Tears. Up to 100 pounds of these cream peas will be donated to families in our community.

> Last season, the Collective funded a shareduse pea sheller for participating farms through our farmer cooperative program. This essential infrastructure helps farmers donate products to your table. It's just one example of how our projects reflect our core values.

> At the heart of our work is a bold, hopeful vision:

> "A future where the Winterville and East Athens communities thrive in health and connection, with equitable access to fresh, locally grown food - nurturing well-being, supporting local growers, and cultivating a resilient, just food system for generations to come."

> This vision is grounded in our commitment to health, equity, sustainability, and community empowerment. We're focused

on long-term solutions, which is why we are committed to building an infrastructure that allows farmers, families, and food distributors to work together in fair and sustainable ways.

Thanks to generous community support, we launched **Get Fresh** in June 2025 – a health and nutrition education program created in partnership with UGA SNAP-Ed, and Piedmont Hospital. Led by Wintervillian Brad Averill, Clarke County's Family and Consumer Science Agent, the program offers classes designed to equip participants with the tools to make nourishing meals and manage chronic disease through dietary changes. The Marigold Collective supports this effort by providing produce bags to all participants.

Blacksmith Shop rehabilitation. construction crew - a lot is from museum staff and volunteers, as we use archaeology to see what stories the building can tell us. Based only on what we've recovered so far, we've already been able to rewrite what we thought we knew about the building's early history while learning firsthand about the material and the people who made it. It's been an exciting time!

The discovery of a hand-drawn map from 1878 has inspired us to create Winterville's newest camp experience. This July, we're literally digging into the mystery of what may have been the first structure ever built in what would become Winterville, and we want you to come along for the ride!

Over the course of a week, individuals as young as 12 and family groups of any age will practice actual archaeology as we try to pinpoint the exact location of Winterville's first train depot (built around 1850).

Attendees will learn real archaeology principles before heading into the field to

n May 15, Fox Gives and the Fox Theatre presented Winterville with the **third grant** (\$58,000) to continue renovations of the **Marigold and Arts Center**, also known as the MAAC.

We are almost finished renovating the brick-and-mortar part of the building. Thus far, the MAAC has been restored and improved inside and out. The performance deck was added outside and the custom mini-bar was added inside. The restrooms, floors, stage, lighting, seating, and backstage areas have all been refinished and refurbished. In fact, there are few areas that have *not* been improved.

SPECIAL ELECTION UPDATE

special election was held on June 17, 2025, to fill the City Council seat vacated by Tina Mills. Candidates included Heidi Spratlin, Dianne Greene, Issac Swier, and Timothy Pierce. Timothy Pierce won the seat and will be sworn in on July 8th. The term of office is until December 31, 2025. We will have another election in November for two seats and two new terms. Please get to know your Council members and stay involved.

Norks Building is being constructed behind the Recycling Center and Public Works. This new building is a shared venture between the city and the Marigold Festival Board. The building will house the Marigold Train, the Trailer, the Cadillac, and various Public Works equipment. This new building will allow the city to free up space in other buildings and allow us to renovate the main Public Works building to include a new home for the Winterville Police Department and updated offices for Public Works and the Winterville Volunteer Fire Department.

It is that time of year again – the city will hold public hearings in July to adopt a millage rate. The city has kept the same 2.9 Millage rate for over 20 years. Public Hearings will take place in City Hall Tuesday, July 1st at 6 p.m. and Tuesday, July 8th at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. Please plan to attend and address City Council with your comments or concerns.

nce a Millage Rate has been adopted, we can start holding our Finance Committee meetings with supervisors to determine needs for 2026. This process begins in mid-July, allowing us to present a budget to citizens by September/October. We will hold public hearings in November, with a vote by Council coming soon after that in November or December to meet the December 31st deadline. Also, the 2024 Financial Audit has been completed and is available at city hall.



Shop renovation should start to pick up steam in the coming weeks. The historic forge has taken a little more attention than expected, but we have been deliberate, delicate and purpose driven in the attempt to re-create something very special that will serve this community for a very long time. The expected finish date for this project is late October so look for your beloved Marigold Collective to be in the building by Christmas!!



he WVFD enjoyed taking part in the Annual Marigold Festival again. This year, I was honored to be the parade's Grand Marshal, to celebrate my 30 years of service with the fire department.

Wow, it makes me feel old when it is written out loud like that. I started as a 20-year-old kid, not knowing anything about firefighting other than the red truck.

As I look back at all the changes I've seen over the years, it's even more amazing. I have served under five mayors, two mayor protem, two city attorneys, and numerous city council members. I have also served at two locations, the first in Front Porch Bookstore. The apparatus and equipment changed dramatically during that time as well. From a 1967 Dodge engine at the beginning to our current engine, a 2022 custom pumper. All this, coupled with serving alongside some of the greatest people I call friends and brothers, is a feeling like no other. Serving as a volunteer firefighter is something I wouldn't trade for the world.
